and at *Gramma's*.

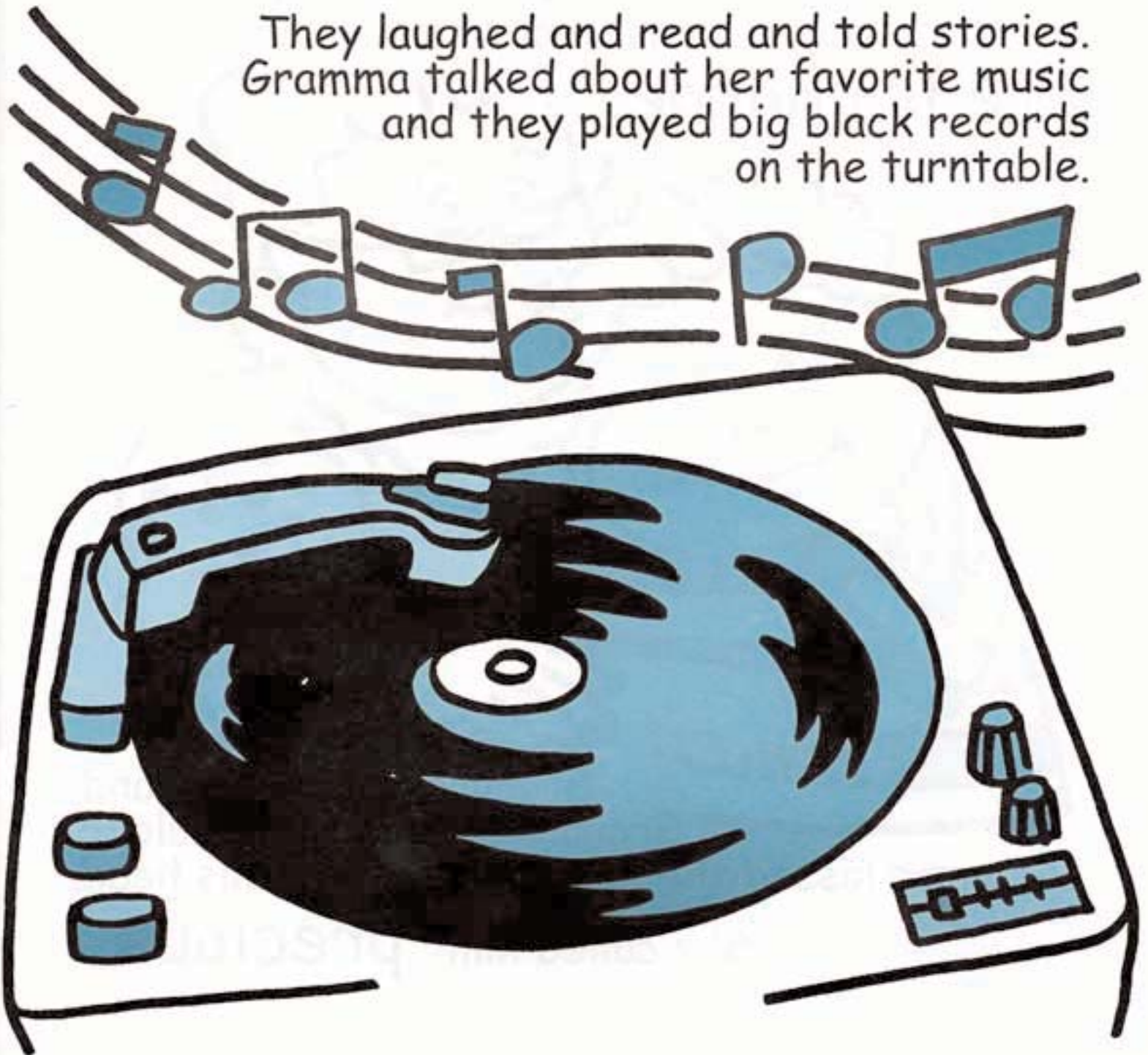


At *Gramma's* they mixed chocolate

She called him "precious."

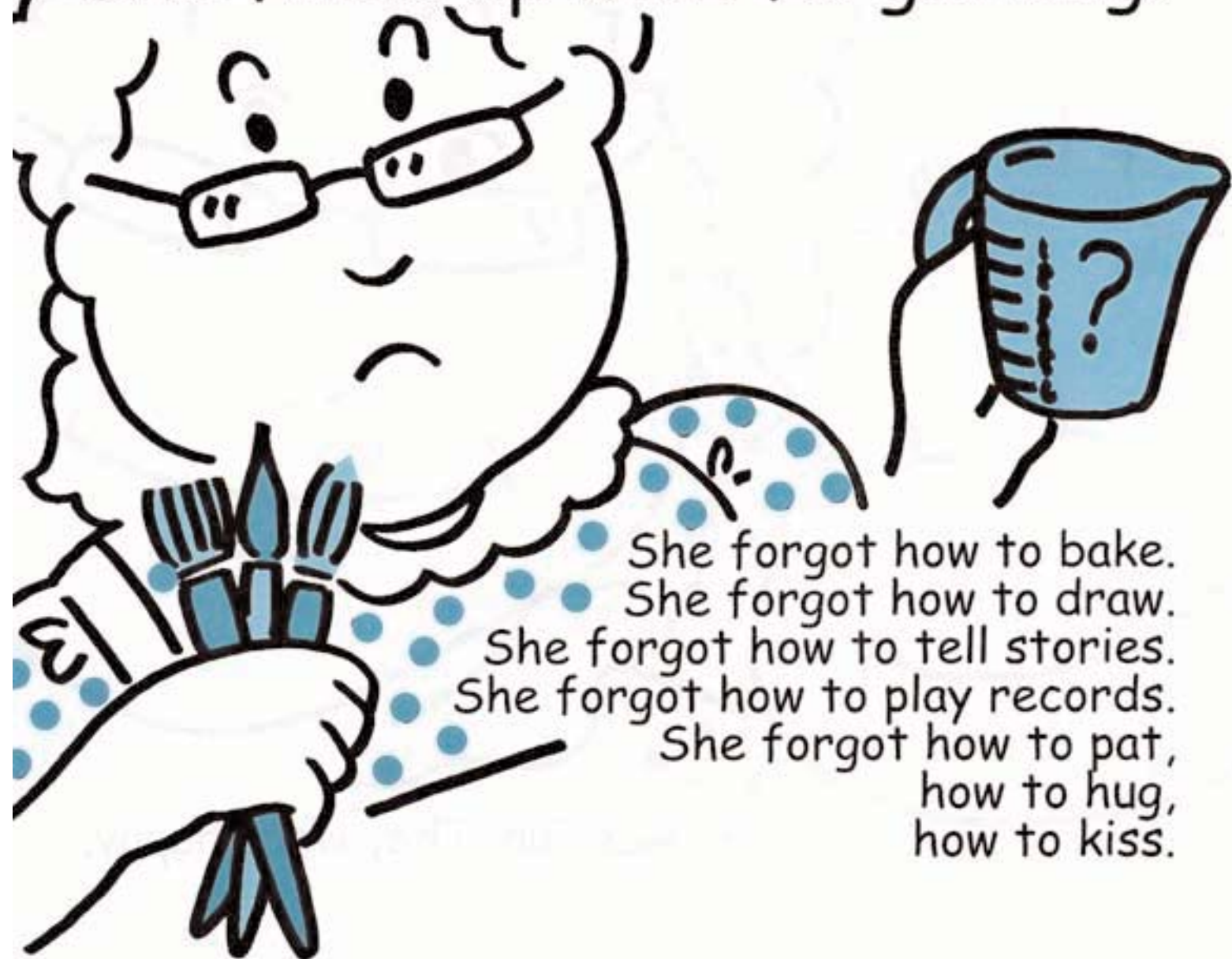
Gramma smiled.

how to kiss.

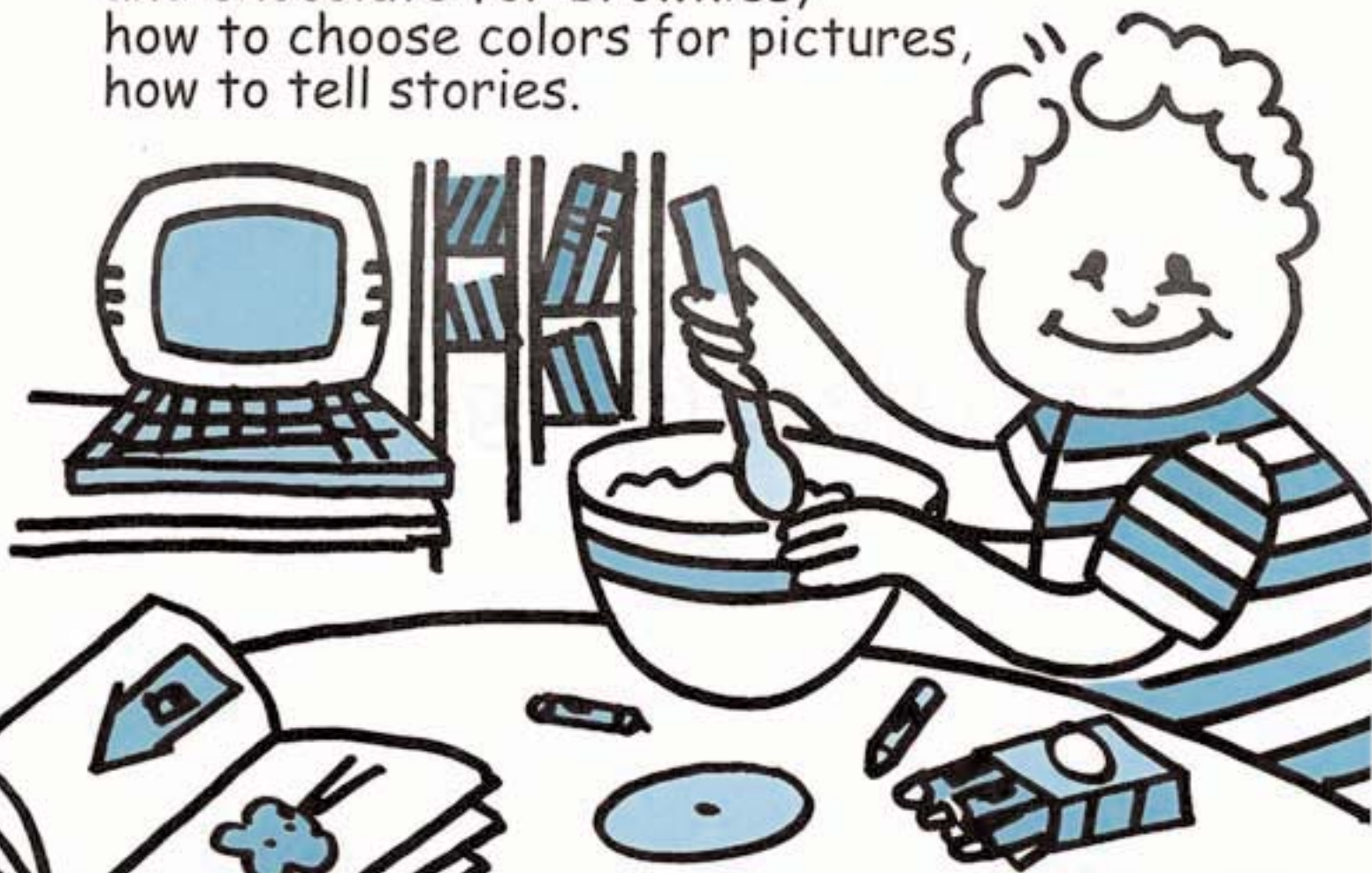
She was filled with forgetting.

He remembered how to mix sugar and chocolate for brownies, how to choose colors for pictures, how to tell stories.

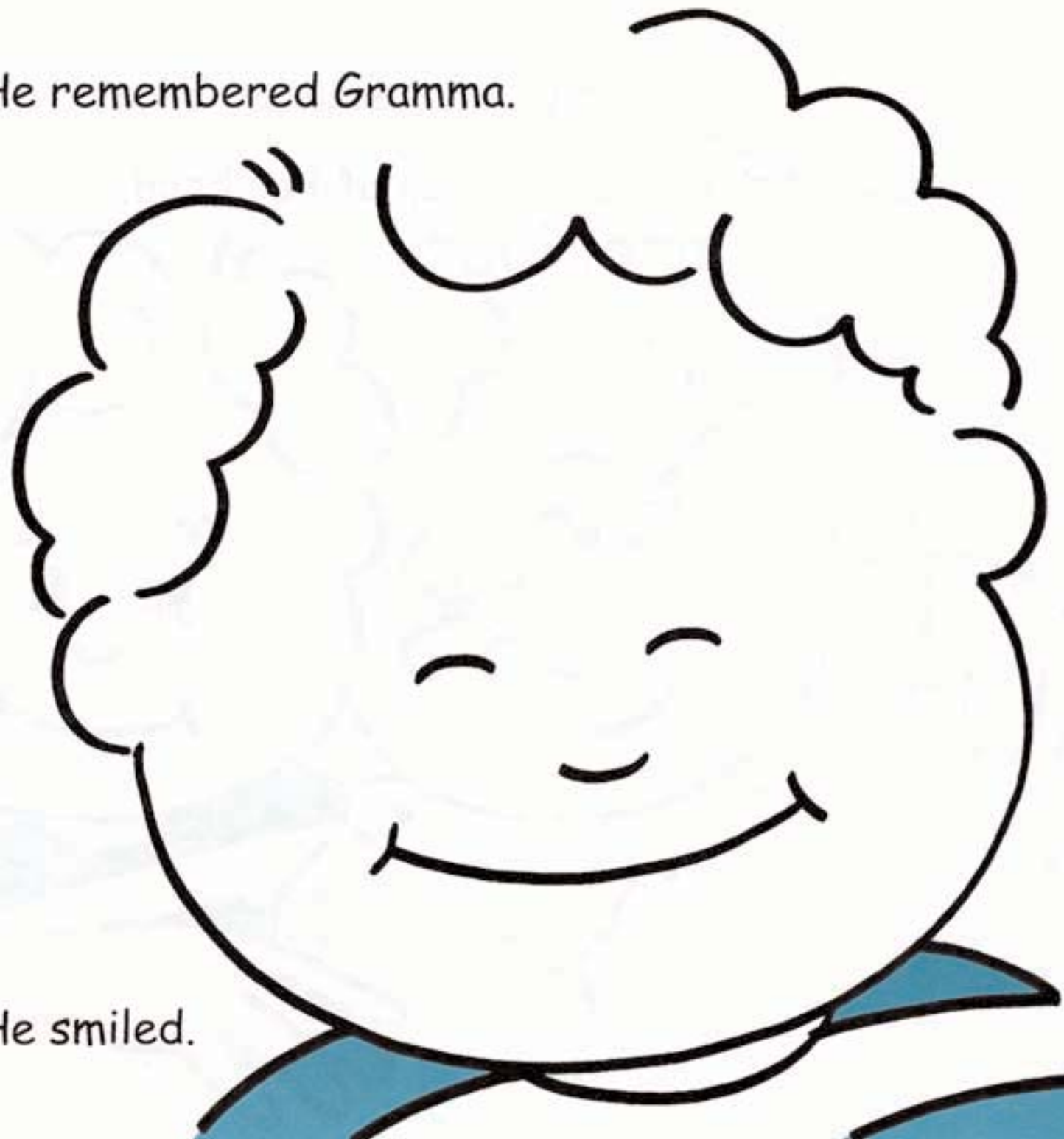


He talked about his favorite games and played small silver cd's on the computer.
